

A brief glimpse at some of the grants during 2023:

2023 tertiary:

In the 2023 round of tertiary grants, 127 eligible students received grants totalling \$289,000 from NWEETB. An additional \$78,000 was disbursed across those students via the JV arrangement with Maori Education Trust and JVs/Tripartites with Victoria University, Massey University and Auckland University of Technology.

The online application form for 2024 grants will open by 4 February, closing 30 April 2024.

2023 Aotearoa Dive Sponsorships & traineeships:

Grants totalling approximately \$12,000 have supported 24 Ngati Whakaue students to obtain their Open Water Dive Certificate through Aotearoa Dive. Two members are progressing towards their Instructor's Certificates through the JV Aotearoa Dive traineeship programme.



School Representative National sport grants:

\$15,760 has supported 64 students with costs to participate in events representing their school at National level.

Learn to Swim programmes

183 children have been eligible to receive support for swimming lessons in the Learn to Swim programmes with SwimMagic and Orange Swim School.
