We hope you are all well and looking forward to a beautiful holiday season! The Incorporation have made significant progress on a number of fronts this year, and we are pleased to share a few updates with you as follows:

NWTL Group Performance for 2021

Despite a challenging year due to drought and market impacts from COVID-19; our commercial lease arrangements and farming operations delivered a solid operating profit. Our asset base has seen a positive growth in value which has contributed to an increase in overall equity to \$57.4m from \$53.8m in 2020.



Wharenui Rise Development

After three years of planning, preparation and construction, we have accomplished the considerable milestone of completing Stage One at Wharenui Rise comprising 52 lots. Work is now underway on Stages 2 & 3 and we will have updates on progress in the new year!



Affordable Housing & First Home Buyers Initiatives

Following a massive response for the affordable homes at Wharenui Rise, we held a ballot with Whakaue koeke, and are pleased to announce that 8 successful whānau were selected to proceed with purchasing their first home. We are expecting construction to start early next year with whānau being able to move in soon after which is very exciting! AGM:

House of Science:

After a number of years supporting the sciences in our schools by delivering the House of Science kits to schools we will be handing this mahi back over to House of Science's main branch to adminster and deliver. We will continue to look for opportunities to strengthen and support sciences and in particular the embedding of science knowledge that validates pūtaiao from a te ao Māori perspective. Our earlier Matakōkiri wānanga was a great example of such a programme. We would like to thank our team that faciliatated this programme and also our many volunteers who helped with this kaupapa.

Te Ahu o Te Reo Māori:

Te Taumata o Ngāti Whakaue are one of the providers across the Bay of Plenty, Waiariki region facilitating Te Ahu o Te Reo Māori. This is a 22 week long Te Reo Māori course which aims to support staff from early learning settings through to secondary school level. This includes any ECE, Kohanga Reo, Kura and School staff who which to grow their capability and confidence in using and integrating Te Reo Māori into the learning of all students. The course also incorporates so much more than just Te Reo Māori, it provides opportunity to learn about and incorporate local iwi kōrero into the curriculum, develop a language plan and strengthen your professional learning networks with others across the education system.
