Ngāti Whakaue Entities Collaboration Project

A collaborative Ngāti Whakaue project has been established across the main Ngāti Whakaue entities to investigate ways the entities can work together more for the betterment of Ngāti Whakaue. A hui is being held at Te Papaiōuru on Saturday 17 July, 10.30am, to present more information on this kaupapa.



The Ngāti Whakaue Koeke Event will take place later this year. More details will be provided closer to the date. After consultation with the Whakaue Whakanuia Organising Committee and the tutors however, a decision has been made to push Ngāti Whakaue Kapa Haka Day out to late 2022.

Financial Capability Programme

At the end of May a rōpū of incredible Whakaue māmā completed the inaugural "Ngāti Whakaue Māmā - Whai Hua Nui" programme. This is an eightweek programme that builds the financial literacy and capability of our Ngāti Whakaue māmā. This was a partnership with Te Puni Kōkiri and delivered completely online. The programme helped our māmā to develop healthier financial habits and to recognise that they can set and achieve their financial goals and aspirations. The māmā said the programme also helped them to discuss money and budgeting with their partner and whānau.

Here's some feedback from Sherry Tait, one of our participants, "E mihi ana ki ngā kaiako o tēnei kaupapa me te Assets Trust nā koutou kaupapa i whakahaere mō ngā māma o Ngāti Whakaue. Ka nui ngā akoranga i ako e au mō te hoko whare me te pūtea kua rau atu ki taku kete mātauranga. He wheako pai, he painga hoki mō āku tamariki i te mea ka tīmata ināianei te whakatō i ēnei mōhiotanga ki roto i a rātou / I am very grateful that I was fortunate enough to do this course. Financial literacy is so important, and in today's climate without all of the expert knowledge and guidance we received the road to home ownership would be very hard."

The Trust sees a lot of potential in this course to support the iwi, and so at the end of May we committed to sending Tatiana, our Kaitaurima Tohanga Hua (Distributions Manager), to Wellington

to complete a Facilitator Training course. This means that the Trust can now run the course. In July we will advertise for the next intake of Ngāti Whakaue māmā.

Kaumātua Hauora and Wellbeing

Over raumati /summer the Trust held multiple hui with our kaumātua to better understand their wellbeing needs and help inform the Trust's thinking around how it can provide support. The feedback was collated into a report and circulated to our participant kaumātua as well as our other Whakaue entities. The Trust is currently developing a programme of kaupapa and initiatives that the Trust will support.

Ngāti Whakaue Emerging Leaders

A distribution goal of the Trust is to "strengthen the pool of emerging governors". We are happy to announce that an Emerging Director role on the Board of Trustees is being created! This is an excellent opportunity for a Ngāti Whakaue individual to gain first-hand experience in governance. The call for applications will go out in July.

In addition, we are designing some other initiatives to support the development of our future leaders, so keep an eye on our social media pages for updates.

Investments

At an investment level (ngā kaupapa haumitanga), the environment remains challenging due to low interest rates and economic uncertainty (highlighted by the recent COVID outbreaks in Wellington and Auckland). We have invested in an iwi owned and managed commercial property fund. The fund has a strong portfolio of commercial properties across the country and pays us a regular income. The other benefit of this fund is the opportunity to foster new strategic partnerships with the other iwi investors, who come from across the motu.

We continue to search for further quality investments and are currently doing due diligence on some local opportunities.

Hai whakakapi, on Saturday 17 July the Trust will hold a hui ā-iwi to provide an update on its activities. The hui will include an update on the collaborative Ngāti Whakaue entities project.

As we approach the end of this financial year, we are pleased to provide the following updates for you:

Iwi Housing Strategy

Earlier this month we had Ministers Peeni Henare, Willie Jackson, Kelvin Davis and MP Tamati Coffey visit Wharenui Rise together with representatives of the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development (MHUD) and Te Pūni Kōkiri. We are looking forward to seeing where we can work together with government to unlock land that may meet the future housing needs and aspirations of our whānau and wider community.

At Wharenui Rise, things are progressing well with all major earthworks for Stage 1 now complete. Of the 51 lots, we have allocated 8 affordable house and land packages which will be offered to Ngāti Whakaue people as a first

preference. These will be people who meet the First Home Buyer criteria and have approved lending in place. Keep an eye on our website and facebook page in the coming weeks for information on our affordable housing scheme for NWTL owners and their descendants.

Associate Directorship Programme

We were pleased to receive 13 applications from Whakaue descendants (9 wāhine, 4 Tāne) who all had impressive skills and experience in their respective fields. It is great to see the depth and breadth of skills and experience among our people, and we hope to have two of these whānau appointed by the end of July.

Kōkōreke Site

Renovations are well under-way on two of our buildings at the kōkōreke site which Manaaki Ora are looking to lease to provide more services to the community.

Featured services this quarter:

Te Ahu o Te Reo Māori:

Te Ahu o te Reo Māori means the future pathway of te reo Māori - a pathway that seeks to inspire and aspire for improved te reo Māori proficiency, acquisition and use across the education sector. It also provides opportunities for te reo Māori to be normalised, and Māori identity and culture, to be shared and embraced. Te Taumata o Ngāti Whakaue are fortunate to have been selected as one of two providers to deliver Te Ahu o Te Reo Māori to staff working in education settings from ECE through to Secondary Schools. This is an exciting opporunity to support our kaiako and kaimahi with their reo journey which will ultimately have positive impacts for our tamariki and rangatahi in schools. We look forward to starting our first cohort of akonga in late July. Housing First:

In this edition of Uerongo we would like to celebrate the success of the Housing First collaborative which is a partnership between Te Taumata o Ngāti Whakaue, LifeWise and Airdale Property. Over the last two years we have jointly housed and provided wrap around support to 107 Mānaha. Housing First recognises that it is much easier for people to address complex needs, such as mental health and addiction, once they have a stable place to live.

Housing First aims to provide permanent housing quickly, then offers tailored support for as long as it is needed to help people stay in their homes and address the underlying support needs that led to their experience of homelessness. look forward to continuing this mahi alongside our partners in the new financial year. We welcome Matthew Heke to our Te Taumata o Ngāti Whakaue team. Matt will lead the development and facilitation of financial literacy and financial capability packages codesigned with the whānau they are intended to support to ensure they are fit for purpose and contain a uniquely kaupapa Māori lens. Matt brings with him a wealth of knowledge and expertise in the area of finance and housing and we are excited to have him on board our waka.



Strategic Planning:

Over the coming months we will be revisiting and refreshing our strategic plan which was last done in 2016. This will allow us the opportunity to take stock of where we currently are as an organisation and where we are planning to head in the future. Part of this process will involve iwi consultation so we will be coming to you in the near future to get feedback and input in to our refreshed strategic plan.




Pukeroa Lakefront Holdings Ltd: WAI ARIKI HOT SPRINGS & SPA

Trade Central:

We are well underway with the refurbishment of the former Trade Training Unit which, when completed, will accommodate Lakeland Mowers & Chainsaws Limited in the eastern end of the building and a "new to town" retailer in the western end.

We also look forward to welcoming another new to town business in the tenancies along the front of Kmart with negotiations under way on two of the three remaining tenancies.

Rotorua Central:

With the relocation of Van Dyks and Flooring Xtra, plans are under way to establishing 3-4 new tenancies within this space.

Management and Operational Changes:

Our General Manager has decided to semi-retire effective August 31st. After 25 years associated with the Pukeroa Group he leaves behind a solid platform from which sustainable income streames can deliver ongoing benefits to our owners and our City. He will remain part time for 12 months or so to assist with the transition of a new GM/CEO and oversight of the Spa development. We will make an announcement of the new GM/CEO in due course.

We have appointed a new staff member to the Pukeroa team. Jess Talbot is responsible for Accounts Payable, freeing up Lee Emery to provide greater support for the Property Team's administration.
